



Marine Science Education and Training from a Hawaiian Perspective on Kaho‘olawe: A Pilot Program for Maui Youth (NOAA PIRO Grant)

BACKGROUND

This grant project focused on providing marine science students at high schools on Maui specialized curriculum with the help of the KIRC staff. The curriculum integrates Native Hawaiian knowledge and traditional practices with science-based approaches to marine resource conservation and management, all done to encourage more local students into the field of marine sciences and resources management. **Grant Life: Nov. 2019- Oct. 2021**

- 16 students and 2 teachers will be able to access Kaho‘olawe.
- Staff will emphasize the importance of the science-based management of the Kaho‘olawe Island Reserve marine ecosystem through the use of local and traditional Native Hawaiian knowledge.
