House Bill 300 appropriates funds for the operating and capital improvement budget of the Executive Branch for fiscal years 2023-204 and 2024-2025. The Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission (KIRC) <u>strongly supports this measure</u> and respectfully request the committee <u>adopts Governor Green's budget amendments</u> with regards to additional funding for the Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission.

The KIRC is the single government agency responsible to provide and maintain on-island infrastructure and services on Kaho'olawe. Our on-island responsibilities include operating and maintaining an OSHA standard, field workcamp to support staff and a volunteer workforce while restoring the devasted landscape of Kahoolawe.

The measure as currently written transfers current KIRC allotted personnel and funding from the Office of the DLNR Chairperson (LNR 906) to a new, dedicated program identification for the Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission (LNR 908) to establish a dedicated funding requirement for the KIRC. Additionally, the measure provides full-year funding for two new KIRC positions (2.0 FTE) previously funded for half a year in fiscal year 2023.

Aloha Senator Dela Cruz.

On behalf of the Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission, I respectfully request your support in the upcoming Senate WAM hearing on House Bill 300 HD1 relating to the State Budget, specifically supporting the Governor's Message (02/13/2023) addition of funds for the Kaho`olawe Island Reserve Commission in LNR908/AC Ser 213-002.

Why should the KIRC continue to receive state funding? When the island of Kaho`olawe was returned to the State of Hawaii in 1994, the legislature found that the island of Kaho'olawe is of significant cultural and historical importance to the people of Hawai'i. Due to extensive erosion and other ecological problems from the introduction of goats in 1793, a new management regime was needed to effectively meet the unique challenges of restoring, preserving and determining the appropriate use of Kaho'olawe. The legislature established the Kaho'olawe Island Reserve Commission (KIRC) to meet those challenges.

The KIRC was initially funded in 1994 from a portion of the federal cleanup funding for Kaho`olawe and has used those funds, until its depletion in 2016, to establish many innovative programs that emphasize ancestral and traditional knowledge, utilizing cultural respect for and connectivity to the environment and integrating ancient and modern resource management techniques. The success of the KIRC's management of Kaho'olawe is evident as several current issues such as Navy/State environmental relationships, unexploded ordnance on State lands and recognition of native Hawaiian traditional practices on State lands utilize the KIRC's model of land management and expertise to help solve their own management issues.

Until such time that a sovereign Native Hawaiian entity has been recognized by the state and the federal governments, the island of Kaho'olawe still remains the responsibility and in the care of the State of Hawai'i. There has been no movement in recent years for any federal recognition of Native Hawaiians.

The KIRC has been able for the last two decades to effectively restore a portion of Kaho`olawe with volunteer labor from the public without major incident or injuries. We are a very cost-effective program with little controversy; able to accomplish much with limited resources; and well regarded by native Hawaiian, environmental, scientific, and public organizations. We are asking for some long-term financial stability so we can make Kaho`olawe a better place than what was received from the Navy.

Aloha Representative Yamashita,

On behalf of the Kaho`olawe Island Reserve Commission, I respectfully request your support in the upcoming legislative conference hearings on House Bill 300 HD1 SD1, relating to the State Budget, specifically supporting the Senate Committee on Ways and Means, Senate Draft 1 amendment that added additional funds for the Kaho`olawe Island Reserve Commission in LNR908/AC Ser 213-002 (\$400,000/FY24, \$400,000/FY25).

The funds your committee provided last year, in Act 248/SLH2022, was a significant contribution to the KIRC's innovative and effective Kaho'olawe restoration and management efforts. The KIRC seeks to make this funding permanent to ensure that the KIRC can continue the long-term operations and maintenance of the Honokanai'a Base Camp, on-island infrastructure, and the KIRC ocean vessel, 'Ōhua.

For over a decade, the KIRC has sought the State's financial support to keep Kaho'olawe facilities operating so that it can support volunteers and island-wide restoration efforts. This year, the KIRC has come the closest to establishing that funding by gaining supporters in both the House and Senate who introduced separate KIRC funding measures (HB354, HB571 HD1, and SB100 SD1) as well as gaining Governor Green's support in his Governor's Message (02/13/2023).

The KIRC has been able for the last two decades to effectively restore portions of Kaho`olawe with volunteer labor without major incidents or injuries. The KIRC is cost-effective; has accomplished much with limited resources; and is well regarded by native Hawaiian, environmental, scientific, and community organizations.
