

Going Mobile: Enhancing the Technological Infrastructure of Kahoʻolawe Island Reserve Commission (IMLS 5) July 2022 – June 2024

BACKGROUND

The proposed project will increase the organizational capacity of the KIRC through technological enhancement of the Kahoʻolawe Island Reserve Commissionʻs (KIRC) current hardlined servers and technical hardware to a cloud-based system that will allow staff to have both in-office and remote access. This project, which is in direct alignment with the State of Hawaiʻiʻs overall technology goals, will advance the stewardship of and access to the Kahoʻolawe Island Reserveʻs collection of natural, environmental, cultural, historical and archaeological resources by building the organizational capacity of the Kahoʻolawe Island Reserve Commission (KIRC) to serve the local community.

DELIVERABLES

- Purchase all new hardware/equipment and software
- Installation of remote workstations and cloud-based server technologies
- Design and set-up of KIRC server file paths
- Staff training and implementation
- System checks and updates
- Pre- and post-surveys of staff usage, usability and experience

Providing Community Access to Kaho'olawe Through Virtual Resources

PROJECT UPDATE: November 2022 – February 2023

The State IT Department have standardized their computers and servers across the board. The project team worked with the ITS department and used the appropriate vendor lists to draft a supply order for the project and submit the ETS-205 request, which was approved last calendar year. We are awaiting the submission and approval of the purchase order for the project's equipment and supplies.

All departments under DLNR must connect to the DLNR's NGN (Next Generation Network) via a secure Routed Network Service (RNS). The RNS line is via fiber optics thru Hawaii Telcom. The price difference from our current monthly internet charges is an increase of nearly \$700 a month. We are awaiting on our Executive Director and Administrative Officer to determine funding source, followed by approval to proceed from our Executive Director.
